Phi Psi Has High Hopes for Future Housing Vision

While Michigan Alpha has enjoyed nearly a decade of success at the 630 Oxford chapter house since our move in 2012, our plan has always been to return to Michigan Alpha's original chapter house at 1550 Washtenaw. This house was built by the Michigan Alpha founders, and the chapter thrived there until leaving in the '70s. We are striving to build equity in 630 Oxford and are accepting cash donations to fund a move back to 1550 Washtenaw—if and when the opportunity arises to return.

What Michigan Alpha Means to Phil Kain '88

As **Phil Kain '88** went through rush (now recruitment) in the winter of 1987-88, he followed his friend and roommate **Pete Han '88** to the Phi Kappa Psi house. "I found Phi Psi to be much more welcoming and friendly than some of the larger houses that I had visited previously," he recalls. "The brothers at Michigan Alpha seemed authentic and genuinely interested in getting to know me." Phil met lots of people through the brotherhood who helped shape him as a man and change the course of his life.

Michigan Alpha was where Phil felt like he was a part of something bigger than himself



for the first time. He has fond memories of the initiation ceremonies in his undergraduate years, especially the pride he felt in becoming a full member. When Michigan won the NCAA basketball tournament in 1989, it was the middle of initiation week where Phil was serving as Pledge Trainer, meaning he had to balance his responsibilities to his incoming initiates with all the excitement that took over campus that week. "What a crazy week and excellent training for how to lead during unusual circumstances!"

Phil started reading *The Wall Street Journal* in college, which helped guide him toward pursuing a career in business or finance. He worked with large banks for over 20 years, gaining experience and contracts in Chicago and around the nation. He wanted to move on to something more entrepreneurial, so after creating a business plan, he took a leap of faith and founded Rush Street Capital in 2014. Phil has served as managing partner at the Chicago-based firm, which provides capital and advisory services to lower and middle market private equity firms, ever since.

Phil's advice to active brothers and young alumni is to prioritize networking in their professional lives. "It's an overused term but an essential skill to learn," he said. "Someday, the young people that you meet will be running companies and will be in positions of influence. You will be very glad that you stayed in contact with them in future years."

"Mike was a true friend and embodied everything that we look for in a brother," Phil said of his friend.
